

How to glue ears down.



Around about 4-5 months of age the puppies start teething and during this period the puppies seem to use the muscles of their ears far more than usual. In some cases where the ears are small this means the ears start to lift off the forehead and if you are not careful the ears will turn into pointed ears like on a German shepherd therefore it is necessary to glue the ears during this period. The photo above is a typical commencement of this period and when you see the ears lift like this the ears should be glued down to the forehead for the next number of weeks until the teeth have changed.



You start by removing excess ears from within the ears and on the forehead.



Then you add some glue (Tear mender ear cement) to the inside tip of the ear.





Also put some glue on the forehead (see below)



One ear glued in place (other still open)



Repeat the same procedure on the other ear.



The final result

Leave for a number of weeks- usually glue dissolves after some time. Do not use un-recommended glues as these can cause severe infections-the glue must be water soluble.
